Argyle Post Office:

- Began in the home of Thomas Guthrie in 1878, 1 ½ miles West of Argyle on NE 11-14-1W. The
 mail would come up from Stonewall where the Guthries picked it up from the railway there. Later
 in 1882, the mail came by rail to Marquette then via Woodlands to Argyle. The post master had to
 travel by foot to the nearest delivery point, in the winter this was hazardous as it was easy to miss
 your home destination if it was snowing and windy.
- Alex Guthrie (Thomas's son) was next to operate the post office, upon his father's death in 1895.
 Alex's brother William built a small store next to the post office and carried a good supply of
 groceries and dry goods. The settlers referred to him as "Timothy Eaton". Alex carried the mail fon
 foot from Stonewall twice a week for \$12.00/week, and received \$50.00/year for being post
 master. On one of his return trips from Stonewall, carrying the mail, he became lost in a storm,
 dropped from exhaustion and was fortunately found by a neighbour who helped him back to his
 home west of town.

Strathewan Post Office:

The Osbourne Family had the Strathewan Post Office in their home, it was a table and some cubby holes for the mail. Before the railway came, the mail came up from Stonewall to Strathewan then on to Erinview and North. Ben Walton had a livery in Stonewall, and would drive the mail up to Strathewan, before the CNoR came to Argyle. Once the railway came to Argyle, Henry Last brought the mail to Strathewan Post Office, which closed a year or two afterwards (around 1914)
